**Configuration UPDATE...** As happens every year, we are very excited to welcome students back to school and part of that process is to let the district and the ministry know our class numbers. Through that process the district has identified that we are eligible to receive another teacher. This is great news as it allows for smaller classes and more direct support between our staff and students. The downside of this is

that we will be re-configuring the school and rebuilding the classes so that there are 11 Advisories rather than 10.

This means that all students will be asked to confirm their Advisory class placements on the rolling boards on

Monday morning when they arrive. Adults will be out front to help with any questions or confusion.

#### **MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT!** – Thursday September 16, 2021

I am sure that you have started to hear stories about life back at school, unless of course your child answers all of your questions like my boys did with "fine" or "good".
