This winter, the Greater Victoria School District (GVSD) will host middle school students from Stance Dual School located in Sao Paulo, Brazil. The Brazilian students will attend classes with their Canadian peers to learn about Canadian Culture and further develop their English language abilities. The Stance Dual School group also provides an excellent opportunity for local students to learn and engage with students from a culture that is different than their own.



Hosting Opportunity: GVSD middle school families are currently being sought to host the visiting students in their homes from January 4th -

March 2nd, 2022. Welcoming an international student into your home is a fantastic way to open your family up to new experiences while developing intercultural friendships. Families that agree to host a student will also receive \$975 in compensation per month for a total of \$1950 for the two-month duration. Families are also supported by International Program Homestay Coordinators which also includes a 24-hour support line.
