- Please have your child log into their Google Classroom using their SD61 Learn account.
  a. Their account id will be the following pattern: *studentnumber@sd61learn.ca*.
- 2. Advisory teachers have posted a simple task to ensure that you and your child can access and submit using Google Classroom. Most of your children are very familiar with this process, but we want te ensure all students/families can access this resource.
  - a. If your child has multiple Google Classrooms (i.e. one for each subject area) please have them check their Language Arts classroom for the task.
- 3. Have your child complete and submit the task.

We are asking that you please try to complete this today (Wednesday) so that we can confirm that students can access their accounts. Teachers will be reaching out to families on Thursday to ensure that students are able to complete this task and will also be able to troubleshoot any issues that you may have.

If your child is struggling to log on, please email your child's advisory teacher or feel free to email me directly (amaxwell@sd61.bc.ca) and I can do a password reset for you.

So on behalf of all of us here at Rockheights Middle School, we want to thank you for your flexibility and patience as we work through these times. We are really looking forward to welcoming your child back on Monday, Jan. 10 at 8:35am (first bell).
