Dear Families,

This is in response to the upcoming Provincial Reporting Order that is coming from our government in which students in grades K-9 will not receive letter grades, but rather, will be assessed using proficiency scale language. describing each student's growth and progression along a continuum of learning. All reports will continue to reflect strengths, areas for improvement and ways to deepen learning.

We will also be sending home more information for parents, and hosting a parent information evening as this will be a change for some families on how we report student progress. This move towards focussing on a student's ability in subject specific skills, is where we are heading provincially, and will help students and families understand what their child is capable of doing and how to support their learning moving forward. We look forward to continued discussions as we make this change to ensure that students and parents understand what this new type of assessment and reporting is all about.
