Last week, I had the pleasure of introducing you to our school counsellor, Ms. Showers. This week I am happy to introduce Taily Wills, who is our Indigenous Educational Student and Family Advocate.

Taily is a Saulteaux woman from Berens River Treaty 5 and was born in Winnipeg Manitoba. Her father is Irish and Scottish and her mother is Saulteaux. She was fortunate to receive some of her education on an isolated reserve in Berens River, as well as here in Victoria. She was also advised by her Indigenous stepmother from Kingcome Inlet. Taily has been a supportive mother for many and has two children of her own and one grandchild. Taily has worked in the mental health field and for the Greater Victoria School District for 16 plus years. She is best described as an educator and truth teller with resilience and persistence. Her motivation for everything that she does is based on the opportunity to give a child a student a person a voice.

Taily will advocate and provide cultural and holistic support, resources and initiatives for Indigenous students in our schools, Nations and communities. We are very fortunate to have Taily available to support our Indigenous students and families and help us ensure this is a welcoming place for all members of community. Our first event will be on Thursday October 13 which will be a lunch for our Indigenous students. We look forward to seeing you then!

We will be hosting our parent Teacher Interviews on October 19 and 20.
