Greater Victoria School District Inclement Weather Protocol

Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is a priority for the Greater Victoria School District to communicate effectively to parents, students and community partners during inclement weather. With cooler temperatures in our forecast, the District would like to remind families of its inclement weather protocol and where to find information about the determination of school closures. The District assesses weather conditions on a daily basis and puts every effort into making a determination by 6:30 a.m. of whether or not schools will remain open. The status of schools and transportation is then provided to local media and communicated to our community.

<u>Report Cards</u> – Yes, report cards are coming. As mentioned there will NOT be letter grades this year as we transition towards the new Ministry reporting order. This is to put the focus on the students learning rather than just the symbol of a letter grade. Hopefully, you can start to have conversations with your child now about how they feel they have done this term. Simple questions like "What areas do you think you have improved the most this term in?" or "Are there areas that you think you need to focus on for next term?" are simple prompts that might help foster conversations leading up to the reception of reports on Dec. 16.

Lastly, a big thank you to those that have been helping minimize the congestion with morning drop off and afternoon pick up. We appreciate you not blocking driveways or trying to turn around in front of the school. In fact, I have noticed some families dropping children around the corner or down by our field and that has helped a lot. Dropping students off away from the main entrance helps everyone as they get a little exercise and the reduced congestion improves

Winter traditions at Rockheights:
