We'd like to take time to highlight a member of the community who has shown outstanding support of our Ramen for Reading initiative. Yoshimune Arima, the head chef and owner of Kizuna Ramen, has been incredibly kind to Rockheights through his generous donation of \$200 in Kizuna Ramen gift cards, as well as the addition of a menu item (a half order of noodles) to raise funds to support *Ramen for Reading*. Yoshi kindly took the time to answer some questions for us about himself and his journey with Ramen.

Q: What is Kizuna Ramen's story?

A: Kizuna means 'Bond' or any relationship in Japanese. I hope one day my bowl of ramen connects people together in between like family, friends, our restaurant, farmers, and butcheries, and like any relationship establish 'Kizuna' through our ramen.

Q: What part of ramen excites you the most?

A: I'd say broth. The ingredients I receive are always present different conditions like different parts of pork, or different types of pork from different farms, etc., so I need to bring them up to the same maximized umami level to make it consistent and it takes around 20 hours to make the broth over two days. It's sometimes hard but every time I make it to that level, I feel very accomplished and that makes me happy.

Q: How has reading been a part of your life and helped you get to where you are today?

A: I read so many books in Japanese when I was young. Since I started to follow my dream as a chef, I mostly spend time reading cooking books :).
