May 3 – Showcase of Learning

This afternoon will be a chance for parents to come into the school and be toured around by your child so they can share some of the learning they have been working on this term/year. It will be an open-house style where parents can pop in in the afternoon and be guided around the school by your child. The events will run from 1pm until 3pm and parents will be able to visit your child's class, have them take you on a tour of the school, and share some of the learning progress that they have made this year. RMS PAC EDUCATION EVENT - May 16 – Evening First Aid Training

The RMS PAC will be offering a chance for basic first aid training for students (with a parent/guardian) on the evening of Wednesday May 16 from 6pm until 9pm at the school. All students must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. The course description is as follows: **Basic First-Aid with CPR C for Youth & Parents (11-14 yrs.) (no AED)** - This fun and interactive 3 hour session trains people how to react and improvise when dealing with time priority, life threatening emergencies. This course includes initial assessment, disease prevention, airway obstruction, adult/child/infant (Level C). This course will also cover recognition and first-aid treatment for head and spine injuries, shock, bleeding, seizures, anaphylaxis (epi-pens/epinephrine auto-injectors), and broken bones. Participants spend the majority of the course doing hands on first-aid, and participating in first-aid scenarios. By practicing with scenarios students gain confidence, learn to improvise, and react in emergency situations.

This course usually costs participants \$30 but due to the PAC sponsorship, we are able to offer this at only \$20 per participant. It is a great thing for your child to know for their safety and the safety of the people around them

Spaces are limited and registration can be done at <u>https://forms.gle/Sox4qCu3123n66wa9</u>. If there is more demand than we can accommodate, then we will have a lottery system and potentially look at the potential of adding another evening.



Lunch details – Many of your students have started bringing lunch items that require microwaves, stoves, or kettles. Unfortunately given the short eating time, and lack of access to these appliances which require access, students are not able to warm up food or boil water for things like instant noodles or some of the dehydrated lunch options. Please remind your child that they need to be packing food that can be eaten without the ned to access kitchen appliances.
