We had our Reader's Choice initiative which aimed to promote reading and conversation around a curated selection of diverse books. The first annual Readers' Choice winning book for Rockheights was Borders by Thomas King, "A powerful graphic-novel that explores themes of identity and belonging, and is a poignant depiction of the significance of a nation's physical borders from an Indigenous perspective." I am so impressed that the students of Rockheights chose this important and current piece of literature as their choice. We also are pleased to announce the grand prize winners of a collection of 7 beautiful books to take home. Congratulations to Cam A. in Div.12, Evy G. in Div. 1, Jack D. in Div. 3, Mason R. in Div. 1, and Faith M. in Div 8. A huge shout out to all the beautiful local businesses that donated and supported us including Starbucks, Esquimalt Recreation, Munroe's Books, Esquimalt Roasting Company, and Parachute Ice Cream. How amazing for the kids and the Rockheights Community to have so much local support to promote reading.

Another exciting piece to share is that we were awarded almost \$2000 in grant money from the Times Colonist Raise a Reader program. Mrs. Hutchinson took two groups of 5 students each to spend the entire amount on manga, graphic novels and novels of their choice. We supported small local books stores and had an incredible experience of filling our baskets full of student chosen books. Thank you to the Times Colonist and the annual book drive that supports literacy.
