Do you have a unique hobby or an interesting job? Are you an entrepreneur, an artist, or do you have a fascinating life story that you would be willing to share? Rockheights is planning a Human Library Event! We are looking for Human "Books" who would be willing to have a conversation with our students. We are looking to provide a safe environment for the sharing of diverse life experiences, stories, and perspectives in order for students and the community to grow and develop an awareness of one another.

If you answered yes to any of the above questions then we need you! (Or if you have a friend or relative that you think would be interested then please share this with them as well.)

We know that middle school is a time for students to explore and try new things. Many of you were probably inspired by people you met when you were the age of our students and this is a chance to maybe pass that on to our students. The "Human Library" is an activity where people are the books and students get a chance to meet some adults that are willing to share some of their experiences.
