April has proven to be busy, eventful, and filled with a love for reading in the Library Learning Commons. We have jumped into a focus on poetry and our maker space. Division 2 have found joy in creating felting creatures and building spaceships using cardboard and our makedo fasteners and tools. Division 9 has also worked on building the tallest structures possible and creating rock creatures after enjoying the mindfulness of the book, *Ishi* by Akiko Yabuki.

The Library has applied for a maker grant from the Pathways and Partnerships Program in our school district. With this, the LLC has purchased light tables in the form of these super cool glowing cubes. The students are enjoying the ambient lighting and seating but also enjoy exploring and investigating all the potential of these sensory cubes.



Another exciting piece to share is that we were awarded almost **\$2000 in grant money from the Times Colonist Raise a Reader program**. We will be filling our library with beautiful and inspiring books using the students' wish lists and

1. The District of Saanich's Child & Youth Division is pleased to announce that the Youth WYLD Leadership Program is now accepting applications for Summer 2024.

This hands-on mentored placement program is perfect for youth who are interested in working with community, becoming a summer camp leader, teacher, lifeguard, fitness instructor, police officer, first responder and so much more. Students must be completing grade 8 in June of 2024 to be eligible to apply. This program is a two-year process in which youth are placed with a mentor to help them gain leadership skills to put towards future employment or post-secondary education. Youth are guided to become confident, self-aware, and empathetic leaders with a growth mindset



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In the last three years, this highly regarded program has mentored over 150 youth and helped them gain experience for employment and post-secondary education in a variety of fields. Many youth who have completed this program now work for The District of Saanich as program assistants and program leaders. 2. *Also from Saanich: Learn how to Meditate with Mary Ann*. In this sixweek introductory course you will learn the skills needed to practice Mindful Meditation. Research supports the benefits of incorporating regular meditation in our daily lives. Whether it is for competitive sports, coping with anxiety, or dealing with everyday stressors, being able to calm our nervous system with mindful meditation has proven to have multiple benefits. Learn the basic tools to meditate while sitting, walking, and laying down. Meditation is for all ages, and this introductory course is for youth. As a teacher for thirty-five years, I've witnessed the stress teens experience with school, friends, family, and sports. The ability to calm ourselves with breath, and quieting the mind through the practice of meditation is a power tool everyone can develop and use for the rest of

their life.
