We hope you had a great break.....



Immunization Information for Grade 6 (and some Gr 7 students)



Public Health will be providing the second immunizations for our grade six students on April 12th, 2024. They will also provide catch-up immunizations to any Grade 7 students who missed their Grade 6 immunizations last year. Only Grade 7 students who have a paper consent form signed by their parent/guardian/representative from the 2022-2023 school year (Grade 6) will be immunized. <u>Student Call Back-</u> If your child is going to be absent, please contact their Advisory teacher or call the school call back number which is just our school number (250) 384-7125 and when the machine picks up you just PRESS 1.

PAC Meeting – Tuesday April 16, 2024. - We hope you can join us for this PAC meeting as we will be looking at our monthly PAC business but will also be having a focussed discussion about the Grade 8 recognition activities that are taking place on Monday June 25.

Partial Solar Eclipse - Lastly, on Monday April 8 there will be a partial eclipse. There was information sent out by the district about this event and some of the concerns about this event. Some of the key points are:

- The eclipse can be safely watched through NASA's online live stream and additional recommendations for safe viewing are outlined on the Government of Canada website.
- Never look directly at the eclipse
- Only view the eclipse if you have safe viewers and filters that meet international standards, and do not use homemade filters to view the eclipse
- If you don't have eclipse viewers that meet the international standard, create a pinhole projector and focus on the projected image, not the sun itself

If necessary, we will be looking at altering the daily schedule so that students will not be outside during this rare event. It looks like the weather forecast is for cloud and rain on Monday so it may not be an issue for us. We hope that you have a great weekend.
