And as the days/weeks fly by it we are already starting to plan for next year. Staff have been meeting with our elementary feeder schools to prepare for our incoming students, as well as this week we will be meeting with the area high schools to help with our grade 8 students and their transition to high school. It is a busy time that also includes starting to look at classes for next year.



There is a lot of input that goes into class building and we try to create classes that will provide the support and social attributes that are best for each child.
