<u>STUDENT SAFETY</u> Just a reminder that we need to be extra careful when picking up or dropping off students here at Rockheights. The congestion that results, especially at the end of the school day, often creates unsafe situations for our students and neighbours. A few reminders that we ask you to follow:

- 1. Please remind your child that they should be using the dedicated crosswalks, as running across the streets is not acceptable and can surprise people driving through.
- 2. We also ask that parents not block driveways as our neighbours need to be able to come and go safely.

Lastly, can you please try to avoid turning around in front of the school as that adds to the congestion and has led to several close calls with students. I realize it is a little further to continue along Highrock, but it does make it much safer for students.


