and actively monitoring their social media interactions to ensure they are safe and healthy especially as students may be connecting with their peers virtually over the holidays.

We were also made aware of Google Chat activity that was in violation of the School District's Acceptable Use Policy and Student Code of Conduct. Given the limited educational/pedagogical use of Google Chat in the school district, a district decision was made to disable Google Chat for students district-wide.

Our PAC is also planning to host a *Parent Education Night* in February (likely Feb 10), where we will have experts presenting on <u>Social Media and Anxiety in Adolescents</u>. This is a topic that I am sure all of you are interested in so please mark your calendars for this important evening. More information will be sent out in January.
